

How to use onsens.

- 1 To accustom yourself to the temperature enter slowly.
- 2 First sit your lower body in the bath.
- 3 You should stay in the bath until you break a slight sweat.
- 4 To enjoy the medicinal properties of the water, do not shower after getting out.
- 5 Drink plenty of water, and rest for a while.



Toi Spa Izu City P37.MAP G-4 The oldest onsen on the West Izu coast, from when water first gushed out during the Edo Period. Blessed by warm weather, this is famous as a summer and winter resort.

Beachside hot springs

Shizuoka Prefecture has a great number of onsen hot springs from which one can gaze out on the sea. Enjoy the feeling of watching the wakes of fishing boats and pleasure craft from an onsen. Watching the golden sun setting over the sea while soaking in the bath soothes both soul and body.

Mountain hot springs

Well-known hot springs in secluded spots i the mountains, surrounded by nature. There is nothing like enjoying a bath and viewing mountain landscapes, letting you experience the changing of the seasons up close.





Visitors are guaranteed an enjoyable experience any time, with western-style gardens, fountain shows, children's play areas, flower trains, grassed areas, and events. 

The 53 Stations of the Tōkaidō

The 53 Stations of the Tokaido passing down Japan's unique highway culture The 53 stations along the famous Tokaido route that connected Edo with Kvoto Shizuoka Prefecture has 22 of the 53 stations painted by ukiyoe artist Utagawa Hiroshige. Much history of these remains even now, communicating to us Japan's unique Edo Period outure of the highway.



The Horaibashi spans the Oi River, and as one of the few remaining old toll bridges. is a popular sightseeing attraction. It has been registered in the Guinness World Records as the "longest wooden footbridge in the world" (897.4 meters).
