The population of Hamamatsu is over 800,000 and the area of the city is the second largest nationally. Located halfway between Tokyo and Osaka, Hamamatsu city is blessed with good geographic conditions, a mild climate and beautiful natural surroundings. Hamamatsu continues to develop as a dynamic and lively city with advanced industries and local cultures, based on the efforts of the "Yaramaika (Let's try) Spirit".

#### Hamamatsu Town Area (Hamamatsu Central Area)

Downtown Hamamatsu is the hub of the city's economy, culture and transportation network. as well as the location of various city functions such as governmental body and information service industry.



Hamamatsu is well-known for its industrial production, particularly musical instruments, motorcycles, and textiles. In this area, there are plant and flower theme parks, history museums, and industrial tourism facilities where you can visit local factories.





# Hamamatsu Town Area

This is the downtown area where JR Hamamatsu Station, the entrance to the city, is located. Here you can enjoy shopping, eating and drinking, while walking around the area. From downtown, some tourist spots such as Hamamatsu Castle and the Museum of Musical Instruments may be visited leisurely on foot.

This castle is called the "Castle of Success", because Tokugawa leyasu, the first "Shogun" (General) of the Tokugawa family, lived here for 17 years as a youth. Towards the end of March, approximately 360 cherry trees surrounding the Castle Tower begin to bloom and many people gather here for cherry blossom viewing. The art museum and the "Shointei" tea house around the castle attract visitors as well.

#### Hamamatsu City Museum of Musical Instruments 07

This museum is the only public museum of musical instruments in Japan, maintaining an exhibition of approximately 1,200 musical instruments from all over the world. The traditional Japanese musical instruments, such as Koto, Shakuhachi (Japanese bamboo flute), as well as the European luxury pianos from the 19th century are well worth seeing.

#### Nakatajima Sand Dunes

Stretching 4km from east to west and 600m from north to south, Nakatajima Sand Dunes is one of Japan's three major dunes. On a windy day, the dunes display a dynamic natural art performance as shifting "ripple marks" are formed by wind and waves. Behind the dunes, the Pacific Ocean stretches as far as the eve can see.

#### Terano Hiyondori • Kawana Hiyondori

"Hiyondori" is said to be an accented version of the word "Hiodori" (fire dance). This dance, based on the ceremony of welcoming fire, is characterized by a violent grapple between dancers. This is designated as a nationally important cultural folk asset.

Shoryu Weeping Plum (Japanese Apricot) Festival About 80 Weeping Plum trees (around 50 years old) are pruned to look like dragons climbing to the heavens. There are also 200 young trees in full bloom during the season and a seven stage waterfall in the garden.





#### **Princess Road Festival**

These Edo-era reenactments of the procession are performed beneath the cherry blossoms along the Miyakoda River. This gorgeous performance, involving more than 100 people including a princess, waiting maids, and followers, will bring you right back to that era.


