
# **◆**Tea

# ◆Mochi katsuo

The first catch of katsuo, or skipjack tuna, is emblematic of the taste of summer. Hamamatsu is all about the "mochi katsuo." Early summer is just when the katsuo comes from its voyages around the sea into Enshunada. Once caught, the katsuo is cut up immediately, leaving a viscous texture like mochi. It does not keep long, so it is hard to ship far away and gets eaten up almost exclusively locally. Take our word that, once you try this chewy sensation, you'll be hooked.
