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### MAP M The Tokugawa Art Museum

The Tokugawa Art Museum holds the classical writing of Japan from early 11th century, "The Tale of Genji," together with other valuable cultural assets and arts and crafts.

10:00~17:00 (Entrance closes at 16:30) Adults 1,400 yen. (May vary by planned exhibit) High School & Univ. students 700 yen, Elem. & Jr. High School students 500 yen. Closed on Mondays (on the following day if Mon. falls on a National Holiday). ### MAP N MUFG Bank Money Museum

This museum showcases about 10,000 valuable exhibits relating to Japanese currencies and coins from around the world. In addition, there are exhibits of Ukiyo-e works by Hiroshige Utagawa, who is especially known for the famous masterpiece, "Tokaido Gousan-uki." 9:00~16:00 (Entrance closes at 15:30) Mondays, National Holidays, 12/31~1/3 10 min. on foot from 01M2. 20 min. on foot from 01S06. ### MAP O Cultural Path Futaba Museum

This is the residence in which the very first Japanese actress, Kawakami Sadayakko, lived in the 1920's. It is registered in the list of national cultural assets. 10:00~17:00 Adults 200 yen. Free Admission for Jr. High School students and younger. Closed on Mondays (on the following day if Mon. falls on a National Holiday), 12/29~1/3 1 min on foot from 01M2. 10 min. on foot from 01S06. ### MAP P Higashiyama Zoo and Botanical Gardens, Higashiyama Sky Tower

Adjoining the zoo and botanical garden, inside this park also find the 134-m-high "Higashiyama Sky Tower" observation tower. In the zoo area, many unique living creatures, i.e., alligators and nocturnal animals, await your visit. Shabani, the handsome gorilla who has garnered attention in Japan and abroad, is a popular attraction! 9:00~17:00 (Entrance closes at 16:30) Adults 300 yen. ### MAP S Tokugawaen

Tokugawaen is a Japanese garden in daijingu-garden style comprising a variety of highlights arranged around a central pond, and is planted with flowers that can be enjoyed throughout the seasons. Features of the garden include land forms of greatly differing heights and existing trees that were incorporated as they stood. 9:30~17:30 (admission until 17:00) Adults and college and high-school students 300 yen; jr. high students and younger admitted free. Closed on Mondays (on the following day if Mon. falls on a national holiday), 12/29 - 1/1 (+81) 52-935-8988

### MAP T Atsuta Jingu

As the second most eminent Shinto shrine after Ise Grand Shrine, enshrining the sword Kusanagi, one of the Three Sacred Treasures of Japan, Atsuta Jingu Shrine is visited by nearly 7 million people a year. It features the Nobunaga-Bel roofed wall, the Niijogochi-Bashi Bridge, and many other things to see. The treasure hall houses numerous items designated as National Treasures and Important Cultural Properties on successive display. Visitors can wander freely through the ground. 9:00~16:30 (Entrance closes at 16:10) Adults 300 yen, Elem. & Jr. High School students 150 yen (Different fees apply for special exhibitions, events.) 01M27 (+81)52-711-4151

### MAP U Shiratori Garden

Enjoy a leisurely stroll in a traditional Japanese garden. In the center of the garden is a pond that replicates the Kiso River, originating from the Kiso-Ontakesan flowing into the large sea of Ise Bay. Japanese tea ceremony house Seitei is also located in the garden. (It can be toured when vacant.) 9:00~17:00 (Entrance closes at 16:30) Adults 300 yen. Closed on Mondays (on the following day if Mon. falls on a National Holiday), 12/29~1/3 1 min on foot from 01M27. 10 min. on foot from 01S06. (+81)52-936-3836

**Cash Withdrawal**  
 In Japan, as there are stores which do not accept credit cards, you should always try to have some cash in your wallet. You can withdraw cash using ATM (automatic teller machines) that accept credit cards or cashing cards issued outside of Japan anytime throughout the year.  
**ATM - Japan Post Bank**  
 Japan Post Bank ATMs accept cards bearing any of the following brand logos: Visa, Visa electron, Plus, MasterCard, Maestro, Cirrus, American Express, JCB, China UnionPay, and Discover. Starting in January 2017, compact machines with added functionality that includes support for 16 languages are being deployed and successfully installed in Family Mart stores. For information on ATM hours of operation and available services, please check the Japan Post Bank website ([https://www.jp-bank.japanpost.jp/en/ias/en\\_ias\\_index.html](https://www.jp-bank.japanpost.jp/en/ias/en_ias_index.html)). JAPAN POST BANK ATM Finder is a handy smartphone app for finding ATM locations.

**ATM - Seven Bank**  
 Seven Bank ATMs will accept cards with any one of the following logos: VISA, JCB, MasterCard, Maestro, Cirrus, UnionPay, American Express, JCB, Discover, Diners Club. Some cards with these marks may not be accepted. Seven Bank ATMs are installed at 7-Eleven stores as well as many other locations.

 Depending on the location, some ATMs may not be able to assist your requests. Even bearing the same "mark", some cards may not be accepted. Japan Post Bank ATMs can also be found in post offices. Japan Post Bank and Seven Bank have websites in English, providing information on the local ATM locations.
